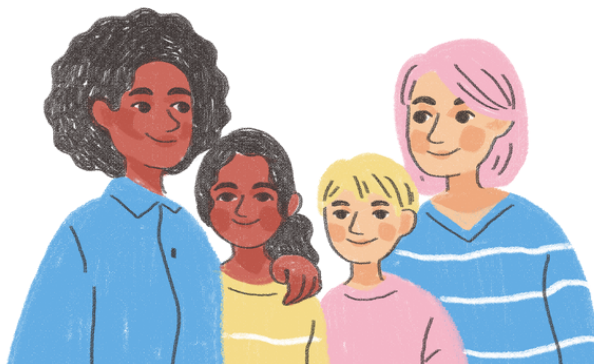


ANTI-RACISM
